

We are an accredited land trust, governed by an all-volunteer board and funded primarily by donations. We are proud to serve our Block Island community and will continue to work to preserve and protect habitat for wildlife and open

space for the enjoyment of all.



The Block Island Conservancy is also an intervener along with the Committee for the Great Salt Pond, the Town of New Shoreham and the Block Island Land Trust in the long-standing litigation to protect the pond from private business encroachment from their proposed expansion by Champlin's Marina. We will continue to stand with our partners to protect the pond.

The Block Island Conservancy is also a strong supporter of the purchase of the Overlook property. This property is zoned for commercial development and because of that, it could be very densely developed. By conserving this property, we will be able to protect a sensitive buffer zone around the Pond in an area that is seeing increasing pressure from development while providing permanent community access to the Great Salt Pond.
